## FIND YOUR RING SIZE

Download and print this simple instructional guide to find the right fit for your Galaxy ring. Make sure that your printer is set to print at 100%. You can verify that the page is printed correctly by measuring a few shapes for accuracy.

### FIND YOUR RING SIZE

**1.**

Your fingers swell throughout the day (who knew?) so make sure to measure your fingers at the end of the day, and when they're warm.

**2.**

If your knuckle is a lot larger than the base of your finger, use METHOD A below. Measure both the base of your finger and your knuckle and select a size between the two for the perfect fit.

### BUYING A RING AS A GIFT

Borrow one of their rings and use METHOD B below.

(Make sure that the ring fits the finger you intend it to fit.)

### TIPS AND INFORMATION

When buying a ring with a wide band, move up a size from your measurement, for comfort's sake.



Different countries have different ring-size systems.



All sizes listed here are standard UK sizes.



The average woman's ring size is about an N. The average man's ring size is about an S.



**Fun fact:**

Your ring size will be about half a size bigger on your primary hand (i.e. the hand you write with).

## METHOD A

### THE STRING METHOD - FINGER MEASUREMENT

1.

Cut a small piece of string, thread or ribbon.

2.

Wrap it real snug around your finger for an accurate measurement.

3.

Compare your measurement with our sizing chart.

4.

Tip: Be careful not to wrap the string too tight. Aim for a comfortable, snug fit.

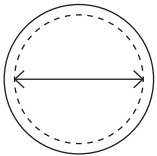
5.

Double check, bbz!

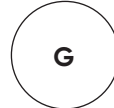

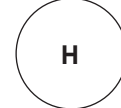
Use the inside diameter to determine the size of your finger.



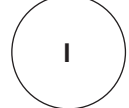

## METHOD C

### MEASURE WITH THE GALAXY RULER

You can use the Ring Belt sizer to find the right ring size, whether you're buying a ring for yourself or for someone else as a gift. Nifty!

#### HOW TO MEASURE YOUR RING SIZE:

1.

Print this document on a sheet of A4 paper. Be sure not to use the option to fit or shrink to page, as you'll need it to be exactly the right size.

2.

Measure the outer box and make sure that it's 170mm by 50mm.

3.

Now cut out the sizer, and then carefully cut the slit at the top.

4.

Push the end of the sizer through the slit and slip it over the finger.

5.

Adjust the sizer so that it sits comfortably around the finger.

6.

Double check that the slider can slide from the base of the finger over the knuckle without a problem.

7.

Last, but definitely not least, read the letter indicated by the arrow. And that's it! You've found the ring size.

#### NB! NB!

It's important that the ring sizer can slide on and off your finger comfortably. Don't pull the sizer too tight as this will give you the wrong size.
